Questions From Our Customers

Q. Help! I ordered a pack of assorted cardstock and most of the sheets are dark. What can I do with it?

A. Here are several ideas for using dark cardstock: Cut it down into smaller pieces and use when layering on lighter cardstock.

Make a card from the dark cardstock and layer on images that have been stamped on lighter paper. (See samples in this flyer.)

For an interesting effect, choose a light colored ink pad and stamp on dark cardstock, or emboss an image on the dark, using gold or light colored embossing powder.

Q. I purchased a Parisian Accent Spellbinders cutting template (page 89 of the catalog). After running it through the cutter, the cardstock sticks to the template. Is it ruined?

A. It is typical for cardstock to stick to a template with a highly-detailed design. We recommend using a straight pin to poke through the holes in the back of the template and push out the cardstock. Cardstock releases easily from templates that have less detail.

Q. Would you consider making clear stamps? I find it easier to see where I am stamping when I use them with acrylic blocks.

A. Clear stamps are easier to use; however, the life of one is rather short when compared to real rubber. When cleaned and stored properly, stamps made from real rubber will last for many, many years.

In addition, the typical clear stamp does not pick up ink as well as a red rubber stamp, and the impression it makes can be blotchy and broken.

These differences are due to the fact that clear stamps are made from polymer instead of rubber.

No one likes to spend money for something that will not perform well, or last long. Our goal is to give our customers the best value for the money they spend, and for that reason, we have chosen to make our stamps from real rubber.
